Recently, she was selected as a Climate Leader-2022 from Idukki by the Sustera Foundation, which gave her more opportunities to organise on-field and social media activities on climate action. She believes that reaching out to people who are pursuing alternative and sustainable livelihoods and learning from them is an urgent need. Her dream is to experience different geographies and ecosystems, which would help to learn more inclusive solutions for environmental issues.

ललिता के लिए ऐसे लेख लिखना, अपनी बात दुनिया तक पहुंचा पाना आसान नहीं था। मगर ललिता संघर्ष में विश्वास रखती हैं। उनका सपना है कि उनके क्षेत्र की लड़कियों को उनकी तरह सीखने का मौका मिले, अपने आत्म-परिचय तक पहुँचने का मौका मिले। इसी सोच को सच्चाई में बदलने के लिए ललिता अपने छोटे से गाँव से हर उस गाँव या शहर तक पहुँचने के लिए तैयार हैं जहाँ लोग लड़कियों की आवाज़ सुनना चाहेंगे।
